

## What will I find at MontanaProBono.net?

- **Library** – Access a variety of useful resources, including: training and CLE materials, forms and letters, model pleadings and briefs, relevant case law, articles, videos and links.
- **Pro Bono Opportunities** – Get involved in pro bono legal services. Use the Pro Bono Opportunities Guide to find local pro bono programs that serve clients who have legal issues of interest to you.
- **Calendar** – Find out about trainings, CLEs, and other events in your area or publicize your event.
- **Legal News** – Keep up-to-date with the latest news in the public interest law community and spread the word about your program and accomplishments.
- **Listservs** – Join substantive e-mail lists where you can find answers to poverty law questions.

## How do I use MontanaProBono.net?

Use of MontanaProBono.net is free. You must be an approved member to access and contribute materials. To become an approved member:

- Go to: <http://www.MontanaProBono.net>. The MontanaProBono.net homepage will appear:



- **Join** - Click on “Join MontanaProBono.net” and provide your information. You will receive an e-mail once you are approved.
- **Log on** – Once you have been approved, click on “Log on to MontanaProBono.net.” You will need to enter your e-mail and password to log on.

Once logged on, click on the Calendar, News, Pro Bono Opportunities, Library, or Listservs links listed on the left side of the page.

The information on each of these pages can be sorted by clicking on one of the view options in the upper right corner of the page. For example, the calendar events can be sorted by date, location or topic.
