Criminal History Check Authorization Form Justice for Montanans Project

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You have applied for an AmeriCorps position with Montana Legal Services Association (MLSA) and the Justice for Montanans project (JFM).

As a requirement of your service, MLSA will use CNCS contracted Truescreen and Fieldprint services to conduct:

- A check of the National Sex Offender Public Registry (NSOPW);
- A state criminal history check for Montana and the state where you currently reside, if different; and,
- A national fingerprint-based criminal history check.¹

Your fingerprints will be used to check the criminal history records of the FBI. MLSA will use the resulting record only for authorized purposes and will not retain or disseminate it in violation of federal statute, regulation, or executive order, or rule, procedure, or standard established by the National Crime Prevention and Privacy Compact Council.²

You must take the following steps to initiate the NSOPW and criminal history checks:

1. Visit http://fieldprintcncs.com. Enter your email address under "New Users/Sign Up" and click the "Sign Up" button. Follow the instructions for creating a Password and Security Question and then click "Sign Up and Continue". Enter our Fieldprint code: FPCNCSMTLegServAssoc1712. Enter the required contact and demographic information and schedule a fingerprint appointment. Print the Confirmation Page and bring it with you to your appointment along with two forms of identification.

2. You will receive an email link to create an account with Truescreen. Follow the instructions and upload your identification.

3. In the space below fill out your name, address, and date of birth as it appears on the photo identification. List any other names that you have used.

MLSA will review your criminal history record to determine your eligibility for service with the JFM project. If MLSA determines that you are ineligible for service based on your criminal history record, you may request a copy of your FBI criminal history record from MLSA for review and possible challenge. MLSA will afford you a reasonable amount of time to correct or complete the record (or decline to do so) before making a final determination of your eligibility.

The procedures for obtaining a change, correction, or updating of your criminal history record are set forth at Title 28, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 16.34.

In connection with my service with the JFM project, I hereby authorize MLSA to conduct criminal history checks on my behalf. In this document, MLSA has informed me of my privacy rights for national fingerprint-based criminal history record checks.

I certify that the information provided above is truthful and accurate to the best of my knowledge. I understand that knowingly providing false information or omitting information may result in my disqualification or termination from the JFM project.

I understand that my ability to serve with AmeriCorps as a part of the JFM project is contingent upon the results of the criminal history check. I understand that failure on my part to consent to the criminal history check will result in the revocation of any position offered to me or accepted by me.

I understand that I will be compensated for the cost of obtaining fingerprints by submitting my receipt(s) to MLSA for reimbursement.
